

# School Spider Offline Update

Some CDAT schools use School Spider to create and host school websites and, in certain schools, for email and text communication. In a limited number of schools it is used for money collection and absence reporting. On Friday 10th February, School Spider informed customers that their server provider detected a beach of their internal network, and they essentially turned all the power to these servers off.

Since this time, they have been working to recover their systems and determine any risk to data stored on those servers and within the School Spider system.

## Key points are:

-No payment data is stored within the system.

-No data was taken out of the system by a third party (confirmed by the School Spider Data Protection Officer (DPO) and Founder today, 14th February).

-Data was destroyed, including the hourly system backups and any messages, parent surveys or forms sent by the school after the 22nd January. The last backup available is that of the 22nd January, which is what is being currently used.

-The breach has been reported to the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) by the server provider and School Spider have stated that they have followed all ICO guidance. The CDAT DPO has called and spoken to School Spider and, together with CDAT Management Team and School Senior Leadership Teams, are receiving regular updates.

-The data breach has been logged in the Trust's data breach log. There is no evidence, based on the information shared by School Spider, of unauthorised access to personal data held on the system.

We will keep you informed of any further relevant information received in relation to this matter.
