Re: Planned Strike Action at Christ Church Primary School Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th July 2023

Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to update you about forthcoming strike action by the National Education Union (NEU), one of the main teaching trade unions. Teachers in the NEU have made decisions regarding their intention to strike or not. This means that those teachers involved in the action will not teach their class or undertake any other duties or be paid on a strike day.

We realise that strike action causes families disruption, but would ask for your support as teachers do not take this decision lightly and are striking for fair pay as well as improved school funding that matches inflation. Clearly this is a difficult situation; if your child or family will be significantly impacted by closures, please get in touch with the school office and we can arrange for pastoral support in school.

This year our school has seen increases in items such as food, electricity, gas, water and resources costs as well as staffing increases. The total additional cost to Christ Church for the past academic year stretched into tens of thousands, whilst additional government funding fell far short of these costs. Obviously this causes great concern for Governors and for me as Headteacher, as we work together with CDAT to find ways of continuing our outstanding provision for pupils with less school income and greater costs, as current finances just aren't sustainable.

Every child's education is important to every member of staff at Christ Church. We hope that by putting in place contingency plans we can support children to the best of our abilities.
