






We have high expectations across all subjects at Christ Church and instill the importance and value in excellent presentation and pride in work.




- There are 25 multiplication questions from any of the tables up to 12x12.

- We practise regularly throughout the year and they love watching their personal best score go up and up!




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
















Learning to play an instrument...

Growing, Changing & Keeping Safe

In Year 4 there are 3 lessons in this unit of work.

Lesson 1: Growing and Changing

The learning intention:

• to explore the human lifecycle

Outcome: children will be able to

- describe the main stages of the human lifecycle
- describe the body changes that happen as a child grows up

Resources:

- pictures of people at different stages of life; from babies to the elderly
- word cards to label the pictures
- questions to help explore the lifecycle
- quiz to check learning

Lesson 2: What is Puberty?

The learning intention:

• to identify some basic facts about puberty

Outcome: children will be able to

- discuss male and female body parts using the agreed words
- know some of the changes that happen to the body in puberty

Resources:

- pictures of body parts
- word cards to label the pictures
- worksheet to check learning

Lesson 3: Puberty Changes & Reproduction.

The learning intention:

• to explore how puberty is linked to reproduction

Outcome: children will

- know about the physical and emotional changes that happen in puberty
- understand that children change into adults so that they can reproduce

This may be through adult support, time, equipment or task expectation.


This is called adaptive teaching and means that no child is at a disadvantage when accessing their learning.
