Risk Assessments

Christ Church has robust risk assessments in place. These have been updated and reviewed in line with the government advice and updates.

Whilst there is a risk of COVID-19 transmission in all public spaces, we can assure you that the team are doing all we can to minimise the risk to your child, staff and families by following the protective measures we have put in place. These are:

- All adults to wear face coverings in communal areas
- Families to wear face coverings at drop off & collection times
- Increased cleaning routines
- Well ventilated spaces
- Reduction of pupils and staff mixing by learning and working in bubbles
- Isolation of all those who present with symptoms
- Pupils to have individual resources wherever possible
- Catch it, bin it, kill it approach

Cleaning Guidance from the Government

How are Christ Church following the guidance?

cleaning an area with normal household disinfectant after someone with suspected coronavirus (COVID - 19) has left will reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people

School have set up an isolation room. Anyone pre senting with symptoms will be taken to the isola tion room which will be thoroughly cleaned after each use.

· wear disposable or washing-up gloves and aprons for cleaning. These should be double-bagged, then stored securely for 72 hours then thrown away in the regular rubbish after cleaning is finished

School staff use aprons, masks and gloves for cleaning

· using a disposable cloth, first clean hard surfaces with warm soapy water. Then disinfect these surfaces with the cleaning products you normally use. Pay par ticular attention to frequently touched areas and sur faces, such as bathrooms, grab-rails in corridors and stairwells and door handles

School staff will clean tables and high touch areas using wash bowls and fairy liquid regularly throughout the day.

· if an area has been heavily contaminated, such as with visible bodily fluids, from a person with corona virus (COVID-19), use protection for the eyes, mouth and nose, as well as wearing gloves and an apron,

School staff have access to PPE in rooms.

 wash hands regularly with soap and water for 20 seconds, and after removing gloves, aprons and other protection used while cleaning

Children should wash hands before leaving home and will wash hands upon arrival, after breaks and before leaving school to reduce possible transmission. School staff will teach and model handwashing. It will be an expectation that this will become part of the school day. Hand sanitizer is available in each room too and refilled each day.

Waste

Waste should be stored safely and kept away from children.

Waste should be put in a bin bag that can be tied and then placed in a lidded bin.

School have lidded bins for each bubble and classroom and have scheduled extra bin collection times with the premises team.

Laundry

Wash items in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Use the warmest water setting and dry items completely. Dirty laundry that has been in con tact with an unwell person can be washed with other people's items. Do not shake dirty laundry, this mini mises the possibility of dispersing virus through the air.

Clean and disinfect anything used for transport ing laundry with your usual products, in line with the cleaning guidance above.

School will ensure that children bring home all items of their uniform daily and ask families to ensure children wear clean uniform to school.

If a child has an accident during the day, dirty clothing will be placed in a sealed bag until hometime. children who regularly have wetting or soiling accidents should bring a change of clothes into school with them daily.

Cleaning and disinfection

Public areas where a symptomatic individual has passed through and spent minimal time, such as corridors, but which are not visibly contaminated with body fluids can be cleaned thoroughly as nor

mal.

School have increased cleaning hours for this to be done thoroughly daily before the next bubble arrives.

- * Use disposable cloths or paper roll and disposa ble mop heads, to clean all hard surfaces, floors, chairs, door handles and sanitary fittings, following one of the options below:
- · use either a combined detergent disinfectant solution at a dilution of 1,000 parts per million available chlorine or a household detergent fol lowed by disinfection (1000 ppm av.cl.). Follow manufacturer's instructions for dilution, application and contact times for all detergents and disinfect ants or
- · if an alternative disinfectant is used within the organisation, this should be checked and ensure that it is effective against enveloped viruses Avoid creating splashes and spray when cleaning. Any cloths and mop heads used must be disposed of and should be put into waste bags as outlined below.

When items cannot be cleaned using detergents or laundered, for example, upholstered furniture and mattresses, steam cleaning should be used.

School are following this advice.

Any items that are heavily contaminated with body fluids and cannot be cleaned by washing should be disposed of.
