Emergency care support times of crisis






Support for mental health, wellbeing and additional needs.

## What will our school provision look like?

From 8<sup>th</sup> March, we are welcoming all children back to school. Children will continue to be taught in groups called bubbles with other children in their year group. The teachers have planned to put children into smaller groups, maximising the staff and spaces in school.



### How are we making school more safe?



We have risk assessed all activities and individuals

Everyone will wash rooms, their hands regularly throughout the day





If a child or adult or their family member becomes symptomatic they cannot come to school and must get a COVID19 test.

School will be regularly cleaned throughout the day & thoroughly cleaned at the end of each day. Resources will also be cleaned regularly.





There will be fewer children and staff staff in a room together; children and staff will remain in their bubbles and not mix during the day.

Children will have their own resources as much as possible.





Doors and windows will be opened allow good ventilation

Wherever possible children and staff will observe social distancing



### Does my child have to come to school?



If your child is well, the government state that it is compulsory for them to attend school.

#### Will my child be tested?



If your child shows symptoms of Coronavirus you will be asked to take them to a symptomatic testing site and have them tested. This will not be arranged or carried out by school but we can help you seek further advice if your child or someone in your household becomes unwell. If a member of a school or household bubble tests positive for COVID19 the whole bubble will then isolate for 10 days.

#### Wirral also provides symptom free test sites at the following venues:

- 1. The Floral Pavilion (open 7 days a week, 10:30am to 6:30pm)
- 2. Greasby Library (open 7 days a week, 10:30am to 6:30pm)
- 3. Eastham Library (open 7 days a week, 10:30am to 6:30pm)
- 4. Birkenhead Market (open Monday to Saturday, 9:30am to 4:30pm, closed Sunday)

No appointment is needed. You can visit any of these centres during the opening times. You just need a mobile number or email address to register when you arrive

Parents may now have testing kits to test children at home on a regular basis (twice weekly)
For those who are able to collect their kits in person, they can go to any of Wirral's <u>symptomatic test</u>
<u>sites in the afternoons</u> (no appointment needed).
