Maths

In Maths we will be continuing to learn about numbers up to 5. We will be developing our ability to subitise (say how many is in a group without counting each object) and using our knowledge of numbers to add and subtract in simple problems. We will be focusing on deepening our knowledge of numbers so that we can rapidly recall number facts, apply this to solve problems and most importantly, talk about and explain our mathematical thinking.

Topic / theme

This half term we will be linking lots of our learning to our themes: All creatures Great and Small! We will be using the books 'Dear Zoo' and 'Mog and the V.E.T' to inform our ply and learning activities. We will be learning about different categories of animals including those that we can keep as pets. We will be thinking about how to be a responsible pet owner and learn facts all about animals.

Phonics / English

In Phonics we will be learning to hear and say sounds in words, notice the initial sound in words and talk about different sounds we can hear. We will be playing games to help us orally blend and segment words (break them up into the sounds within and vice versa to say a whole word.

We will be focusing on a nursery rhyme each week, thinking about the vocabulary involved and learning the meaning of any unfamiliar words as well as rehearsing and performing the ones we learn.

Our busy time learning activities will all be linked to our class texts and themes, staff will also take note of the children's interests or events they may have been to and bring these into our learning.
