Maths

We will be busy revising lots of arithmetic, reasoning and problem-solving work to equip our children well for their education at Secondary School.

Cross curricular topic 1: The children will continue their work on area and perimeter and use this knowledge to plan an garden space. They will also learn how to scale up and scale down the size of their garden. Following on from this, the children will solve costing problems related to their garden design.

Cross curricular topic 2: We will be collecting and comparing data on different African countries related to rainfall and species.

Science/Topic

Science: The children will be working to identify types of habitat. They will explore animals found in habitats and how they adapt to suit these. They will research into Fossils and the theory of evolution. The children will also extend their knowledge of the water cycle.

Topic: This half term the children will compare the physical and human features of different African countries. They will extend their understanding of the history of Africa, particularly South Africa and the apartheid. They will be given the opportunity to discuss and debate such topics.

Computing – To begin our Africa topic, children will take a tour to countries within the continent using VR and AR technologies. Throughout the topic, we will explore terrain and landmarks using mapping apps. Year 6 will also take part in the creation of video messages welcoming children in Year 5 back to school.

French - Children will continue with their weekly language lessons, consolidating their learning so far, learning classroom objects and how to describe themselves in French

The Arts inc drama

The children will explore the different arts and cultures in Africa. They will analyse different African patterns and create their own. They will produce sunset paintings and Savannahs collages. Further to this, they will create artwork linked to different African animals.

During this half term the children will audition for parts in the end of year production, 'The X Factory.' They will undertake some rehearsals in school and also be provided with a script and song lyrics. Children are expected to learn their lines and lyrics at home. Dates and arrangements for the performance will be sent out during the final half term.

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PE and Well being
