Community resources at Christ Church!

Social Supermarket is OPEN at Christ Church

We are also very excited to be launching a social supermarket – here at Christ Church! Lots of you will have noticed the new shelter on the front playground by the green gate. This has been set up and stocked by Neo. The social supermarket is a facility open to <u>everyone</u> and will operate every **Tuesday and Thursday between 3.15-3.45pm.**

Neo Community is a community organisation working within The Wirral and the North West, tackling food insecurity at the grass roots. NEO operates the 'pay-as-you-feel' system in our school shop at Christ Church C of E Primary. The pay-as-you-feel concept is fundamental to NEO and is as important to us as reducing food waste.

People are asked to pay what they think is a fair price for the goods provided, at a price they can afford. Neo have found that the pay-as-you-feel concept fosters a sense of community and enhances the relationship between the people who run, use and volunteer at NEO – something that doesn't happen in the mainstream economy.

We equally value the alternative of people volunteering their time, skills and energy to support NEO and the school. This can be as simple as offering to do some gardening in the school's allotment or helping with the community shop. If you feel able to volunteer your time in exchange for goods from the supermarket, then please speak to Mrs Baker and she will take your details and will then make contact with you to confirm arrangements.

We do hope that families will find these services beneficial.
