Look what we enjoyed this week

Pre-school have continued to enjoy to ready 'Happy to be me' and we also used developed our sensory skills by smelling and tasting. The children particularly enjoyed the curry powder and toothpaste but were not as keen on the aniseed smell! Our pre-school children loved making their brain head-bands in our MyHappyMind lesson.

FS2 have enjoyed becoming superheroes this week after reading "Superkid". We have made masks and capes, drawn our favourite superheroes, thought about what super powers we would like and even done some superhero dancing. We have also loved learning outdoors. We found tasty vegetables in the allotment and loved preparing and munching them.

Year 1 In Geography, we have been looking at how food gets to our plate and the farm to fork journey. We matched food sources to their products and wrote a sentence to match. In English, we created our own menus filled with delicious choices to fill our bellies!

Year 2 have been writing a fact file all about Harvest and how people around the world celebrate the festival. The children read information texts and answered questions, written in full sentences. The grown ups were impressed!

Year 3 have been busy rehearsing for their Values assembly this week. In maths, we have been looking at methods for subtraction and in English children have been revising and editing their Stone Age diary writing. In Science we enjoyed researching the inspirational Mary Anning, the unsung hero of fossil discovery.

Year 4 have had a busy week doing cookery lessons making summer fruit crumble, forest school, having big discussions on what we love about our world and learning all about neuroplasticity in our Happy Minds session.

Year 5 This week year Five have been learning all about counting on to add. In English, we have finished the first part of Beowulf and enjoying reading the Last Bear and Finding Bear as our team read. We have also been writing our own renga style poems all about Harvest.

Year 6 have been writing poems based on life in Victorian Britain. They have used a range of figurative language to depict what is was like. In maths, they have investigated negative numbers in real life contexts and have started to solve challenging problems involving the four operations.

Nurture class have been searching for materials in forest school to build a raft and testing out if it will sink or float.

Harvest 2023 at Christ Church C of E Primary School, Moreton

It is that time of year again to celebrate Harvest, to give thanks and share the wonderful things that God has given us!

Please find details below of how we will be celebrating Harvest this year:

1. As in previous years, we will again be receiving Harvest collections to donate to Charles Thompson Mission, Birkenhead and Wirral Foodbank. These organisations support local people in need; be they local families in times of crisis, the elderly or those who find themselves homeless. If you are able, we would request that each child donates at least one item of food that we can give to these worthwhile charities.



We ask that each group from pre-school to Y6 bring their donations into school so we can build up a collection in the hall before they are collected. Please can these donations be sent into school during the week between Monday 16th October – Thursday 19th October. These donations will be collected on Friday 20th October by the named charities.

2. Experience Harvest in School

Children will be having a day of reflection on Monday 16th October and will all take part in Experience Harvest. This will include looking at Harvest of the grain, flock, earth, sea and garden. This is always a special time for children and staff to come together for a period of thinking and praying whilst understanding and appreciating the different values that harvest teaches us: patience, peace, humility, joy and generosity.
