**Key skills:** to understand and to apply:

**Musical elements;** Pulse, rhythm, and pitch - just over half of the teaching. Dynamics - an eighth; equal weighting, though less, for timbre, structure and texture. Notation is introduced.

Improvisation and composition; to be able to improvise and to compose using 3 notes from the range C to A

Listen and Appraise; answer questions relating to musical elements, focusing on texture, style and timbre.
