Look what we have enjoyed this week...

Pre-school have been learning all about their new book, 'The hungry caterpillar,' and are enjoying learning all about the life cycle of a butterfly.

FS2 have been learning all about courageous advocates from the past and present this week. They have thought about the work of Rosa Parks, Nelson Mandela, Greta Thunberg and David Attenborough and how their choices affect our world. They enjoyed looking closer at the life of David and enjoyed hunting for fossils, building bug homes and spotting birds in Forest School. They want to be courageous advocates and will work hard to learn how they can make a difference to our wonderful world that God created over the next few weeks.

Year I have explored the suffix -ed and -ing. And have written amazing independent sentences using their amazing phonic skills. In maths, they have started to look at numbers to 40, partitioning using tens and ones. In Geography, they enjoyed looking at a map of the Wirral to see where Eastham and Chester were. The Year I children enjoyed discussions about motorways and trainlines to connect the two places. Their independent maps were phenomenal!

Year 2 started the week with PE in the sunshine and have started to learn how to tell the time in maths. In history they have learnt all about the Montgolfier brothers and their hot air balloon. We are all looking forward to our trip next week too!

Year 3 have had a great start to the half term. They have started learning about money in Maths, thinking about how much items cost. In English they have become a Playwright, creating their own play script based on their narrative New Brighton Cinderella. Science has been all about forces, this week was about friction.

Year 4 took on the role of a group of Vikings hoping to settle on the Wirral peninsula. They wrote speeches and presented them to the Queen of the Mercian English, explaining why they wanted to settle here. We have been amazed at their fantastic geographical language and knowledge.

Year 5 enjoyed a lovely coffee morning with their grownups this week! They have been working tremendously hard in their first week back. They have plans, drafted and wrote their persuasive letters to Dame Angela Eagle to request more bins in Moreton. In maths, Year Five have conquered fractions and are moving onto time tables and graphs. We have completed AR reading quizzes, hosted a tag rugby tournament and enjoyed practising our fielding and batting skills in PE. What a fabulous week for our amazing Year Fives.

Year 6 have been exploring what it would have been like to experience an air raid during world war 2 They will now use this knowledge to provide a descriptive piece of writing next week.







Mothers Day Sale

Dear Parents and Carers,

World Book Day, takes place on Thursday 7th March and we are excited to celebrate. We have a fun filled day planned; see below for further information:

- Children and staff are invited to either dress up as their favourite book character or to decorate a t-shirt along the theme of their favourite book.
- During the day, our school reading ambassadors will work with different classes across the school, taking the lead to create 'Reading Rivers' focusing on the journey as a reader.
