



School Uniform

All children must wear our school uniform so that they feel a part of our community.

Christ Church Uniform is:

Grey trousers

Grey school skirt or pinafore

White shirt

School tie

Grey jumper or cardigan

White, grey or black socks or tights

Black sensible school shoes (we advise FS2 children do not wear shoes with laces unless they can tie them independently)

Girls hair accessories should be limited to bobbles or ribbons and these are to be yellow, white or black

In the Summer:

Yellow summer dress (gingham or striped)

Grey school shorts

PE Kit:

Black or white shorts

White t-shirt

Black pumps

For reasons of safety children with pierced ears may wear small round gold studs only—no other jewellery may be worn.

Please also provide a sun hat in warm weather.



Books

Your child will be able to choose a library book from our class libraries every week to take home and share at story times. This book will need to be returned to school every week to be changed so you can enjoy a new one each week.

In addition to this your child will bring home a weekly reading book which they will be able to read to you as their reading skills progress. Again, this will get changed weekly.

You will find more information out about this when your child starts school.



School Dinners

Your child is entitled to a universal free school meal at school. They will be able to choose from a selection of hot and cold dishes. The menu changes weekly and includes a roast dinner, fish and chips, jacket potato with a range of fillings for the hot dinner and sandwiches and wraps with a filling of choice including, tuna, cheese and ham at the deli bar for the cold selection. Foundation Stage Information for Parents





Welcome

Our Foundation Stage provides care and education for children aged 4 and 5 years.

We are fortunate enough to have two teachers, and two teaching assistants in Foundation Stage so we can make sure that every child gets the best possible care and education.

The classrooms are spacious and have their own toilets and an outdoor area enabling children to move freely and gain independence in selecting activities. The children are grouped at different times during the day so that children may receive input relative to their age and stage of development.

We work hard to create a happy, loving atmosphere where every child feels valued and special.



A Day in Foundation

Parents arrive via the main school gate from 8.45am where the children can play in the playground until the whistle blows at 8.55am. We welcome families and are always available and happy to chat at the beginning of the day. We are also available at the end of the day for more detailed discussions.

Children access our continuous provision activities throughout the day; supported by staff to develop their skills and understanding. Teacher input, small group sessions and individual support ensure that each child is motivated, encouraged and challenged.

Children may bring a packed lunch or have a school dinner. They are offered fruit and milk in the morning. Children need to bring a water bottle into school everyday which can be accessed at any time.

The end of the full school day is 3.15pm and parents collect their child from the back playground outside the FS2 outdoor area. The teacher will only allow each child to leave when their parent arrives.

Foundation stage staff are first aid qualified.

In Foundation children learn about school routines and how to get along with others. They begin to learn and develop and become excited by what they can do.



Education

We constantly observe and assess children so that we may plan for their next stage of development. As they progress we record their learning and share this with parents at parents evenings and in a written report at the end of the year. The children follow

the areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage:

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development, Communication and Language, Physical Development, Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World, Expressive Arts and Design.

Your children will also have daily collective worship sessions and weekly RE sessions.



Extra Curricular Clubs

The school has a toast club from 8.15am and after school activities available for children once they are in fulltime education. They are run by qualified staff and offer a range of sports and craft activities. Places are bookable in advance at the beginning of each half term. For further information contact the school office.
