Maths

This half term, the children will learn to add and subtract with numbers up to 10 000. They will use the column method for addition and subtraction and they will also learn mental methods for addition and subtraction. Pupils will be encouraged to think about when is the most appropriate time to use each method. They will use the methods taught to solve word problems: visualising the problems using the bar model.

<u>Topic</u>: Romans: Where do the Romans fit on a timeline of recent historical events? Why are the Romans important? What was the Roman Empire? How have the Romans influenced Western civilisation? What made the Romans ahead of their time?
