Maths

During maths this half term, we will consolidate learning so far and begin to look at percentages, decimals and algebra. As part of our World War 2 topic, we will also look at coordinates.

Children will apply their mental arithmetic strategies when solving problems.

Science and computing

Electricity

Children will investigate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit. They will compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches. Furthermore, they will recognise symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.

Computing

Children will use digital media and produce Propaganda posters from World War 2.

PE and PSHE

Children will take part in a weekly 2-hour PE session. The topic for PE this half term is netball. There is an opportunity to take part in an after school tournament on the 12/1/22 from 3.30 - 5pm.

Please remember that your child is to wear their school PE kit on Tuesday or Friday.

During, PSHE children will gain an understanding of their and others' emotions, looking after our bodies, sleep, drugs and alcohol.
