# World Book Day

Dear Families & Friends,

Thank-you for supporting children to have a super day celebrating reading! We really enjoyed having parents visit our classes, seeing the children in their costumes and talking with them about their favourite books and characters.

# COVID19

Thankfully, we have kept healthy and had only a few positive cases reported at the start of this term. We will continue with our enhanced cleaning, ventilating rooms and handwashing routines and will also continue asking families to take children for tests if they present with symptoms or are identified as a close contact. All negative results will enable pupils to return to school quickly and give reassurance that we are minimising potential transmission. Thank you so much to all families for supporting our protocols and helping to keep everyone safe.

In line with the Government's National policy, we have relaxed restrictions and are returning to the school practices of nearly two years ago, whilst keeping some of the positives we learnt during the pandemic. Children are now mixing more widely and will only return to class groupings if we have increased numbers of cases in an individual class – we are all hoping and praying that this doens't become the case and thank you all for continuing to be vigilant.



As part of our return to 'normal' we are delighted to be hosting face to face parent teacher meetings on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> March. If you have missed booking your appointment please phone the office urgently and they will let you know which spaces are available or email the year group to request a time slot.

Please access school via the main entrance and we will direct you to your child's class. Please do not attend if you are unwell or showing any symptoms of COVID as we do not want to rsik any transmission into school. As teachers will be seeing a number of families each night they will distance from you, just to be cautious. It will be lovely to see everyone face to face and is very much needed; you will also have the opportunity to look at your child's books and see their classroom – something we have all missed for a long time!

# PE Kits and Uniform Changes

During the pandemic we stopped pupils changing for PE to reduce fibres and airborne particles. As we have ceased restrictions we will be returning to pupils changing for PE from w/c 14<sup>th</sup> March. This may be tricky for some children so we do ask you to support us and help to prepare your child for this change. If your child has a PE lesson in the morning they can come to school in their kit and bring uniform to change into. If they have a PE lesson in the afternoon, they should attend school in their uniform and change for PE then can wear their kit to go home. This means they will only be changing once.



# WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO CHANGE FOR PE AGAIN?

We have noticed that many of our younger pupils struggle to dress and undress themselves; changing for PE helps them to become independent and also to get their clothes organised – by doing this in school it will also help children with self care at home!





For older pupils, it is important for them to develop their organisational skills; bringing the correct kit and equipment and keeping track of their belongings. This will incarese rapidly in secondary schools, so part of the primary school responsibility is to help pupils develop these independent skills. It is also important as children get older, that they recognise the need to change clothes for physical activity to keep fresh and hygenic.

Children have missed many of the social and emotional developmental opportunities as well as curriculum content. We have held back re-introducing PE changing, but feel now is the right time to return to this as an expectation. Children will be supported in their classrooms and older pupils will be provided with more privacy when changing.

If you have any worries about your child changing for PE, please discuss them with your class teacher.

# **Talking to Children About Ukraine**

We know that the recent events in Ukraine have left many people feeling uncertain and worried. If you or your children are struggling, the British Red Cross <u>wellbeing resources\*</u> may help (*\*click the link*) with practical ideas and advice to

help you cope. We know that children may be listening to adults around them, seeing things in the media and having difficulty understanding what is happening in Ukraine. As a school, we will support children and reassure them as well as praying for a peaceful resolution and aid for all those who are suffering and feeling afraid. We had a quick and generous response to items collected for Ukraine and our teachers took your kind donations to a drop off centre after school on Thursday – they will be arriving at humanitarian checkpoints very soon. #### **Exciting Visitor to Celebrate the End of Restrictions**

On Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March we will be welcoming The Bishop of Birkenhead to Christ Church to worship with us and give thanks to God for keeping our community safe during the pandemic. That week will be two years since schools in the UK were asked to close their doors and go into lockdown for the vast majority of pupils. It wll be a

time to reflect, praise and hope for better things in the future and an end to COVID19 impacting upon children's schooling. We know that for several families the effects of the pandemic will be long lasting; relatives may have been seriosuly ill or even died and the mental health and anxiety of our families is ongong for many. We also know how

hard children are finding returning to routines and boundaries after such a long period of uncertainty, so it is important that we mark this anniversary and focus on hope for the future for our pupils and families. # **Roofing Works**

Phase 1 of the roof works are finally complete and the current scaffolding will soon be removed. Phase 2 involves work on the appex roof above F2 and class 10 aswell as the corridor along the Y2 and Y5 classrooms.

Each activity is risk assessed to ensure we are safe in the building and any areas outddors are sectioned off to keep everyone safe. The full works are due to be completed by Easter so we are hoping for good weather so we can reach a conclusion to this extensive project. Thank you for your patience during this ongoing work.

Any changes to routes will be notified indivdually to year group families affected so you can support your children.



### Pre-School – new classrooms for Y4!

We have explored many, many options for our new pre-school and have come up against repeated barriers, however, families continue to request this provision so we are determined to move forwards to support our community. We now have a solution; that is to construct two new Eco modular Year 4 classrooms on our back playground, complete with cloakrooms and toilet areas.

The rooms are a beautiful standard and will be linked to all existing utilities and wi-fi etc. This will be a super opportunity to house our year four pupils together to support teaching and learning organisation, as they are currently the only year group with classrooms separated.

#### New F1 classroom



Once moved, the vacant year 4 classroom at the front left hand side of the main building will become our pre-school classroom. This room has its own pupil toilets, adult toilet and small ante-room. It is also alongside the current F2 rooms and so is a perfect solution to develop our Early Years provision. The EYFS will then have a wider playing area allocated to them so that we can provide high quality learning environments for our youngest pupils.

Due to the new plans, there have been some delays which we know will be frustrating for families waiting for us to open. We do appreciate your patience and will let you know as soon as we have confirmed dates. The new build is being placed on the back playground so that it doesn't impact negatively on our neighbours living locally. It is a very quick installation of approximately 2-3 weeks and situated along the tree line so that it won't be visible to neighbouring homes.

We would very much encourage families to access the council planning portal to register your support for this project so that we may continue with plans as soon as possible. We will send you the link to provide your support as soon as we receive it from the council planning office.
