COVID19

Whilst we are enjoying living without restrictions and all the benefits of returning to normal life, rates of cases Nationally and locally are still high. We have coped so well as a school community throughout the past two years thanks to parents supporting school arrangements. We are so glad that children will no longer have long absences from school, however we still need families to make sure children don't attend if they are unwell, especially with a temperature. Several local schools have needed to partially close to year groups over the past month due to high staff absences, please be sensible when your children return to school so that we can remain fully operational.




Bouncing Back – how has the pandemic affected you and your child?

We know that children have had their childhood disrupted by the pandemic and there are gaps in the opportunities for them to develop socially and emotionally. Educators across the country are reporting high levels of pupil anxiety and challenges with independence and relationships. We have seen this during this academic year for many of our pupils and also the remaining anxieties of our parents and carers as we all try to cope and move forwards. We know and understand how hard this has been and we also recognise that it will take time and different approaches for children to catch up on these lost opportunities. We want to work with families to achieve this and so have commissioned Emma Weaver, a specialist in human brain development, to work with us next term so we can bounce back better!

The whole school staff will be attending a training session with our Headteacher, SENCO and SEMH leads after school on Monday 25th April and we will then be hosting a series of “afternoon tea” sessions where families can come and work with school staff and Emma to share some cake and learn about why adults and children have found returning to “normal” life so challenging. No judgement, no blame - just time together to understand the impact of the pandemic, why children are finding things tricky and what we can do at home and school to support them best. Further details will follow, but I would encourage as many parents as possible to join these expert sessions, delivered with a warm and friendly approach. All sessions will be after school and last for an hour and a half – advance notice of dates are:

- 17th May – Infants **Building independence, growing in resilience, positive relationships and help at home**
- 24th May - LKS2 **Good routines, perseverance & resilience, managing challenges, friendships and fall outs**
- 7th June - UKS2 **Self-regulation, independence & responsibility, getting stuck, being resilient, social media care**



Roofing Works

We are hoping that the roofing works will be completed during the Easter holidays and the scaffolding and work cabins be removed. This will be dependent upon good weather and a welcome relief for the works to be completed. The roofers have done a super job; the school is almost water tight and the roofs are looking much improved.

Secondary School Meeting for Y5 Parents

Tuesday 26th April 5-5.45pm

Parents are invited to a meeting to explore the application process for secondary school and find out about the 11+ testing arrangements for Grammar School. Please do try to attend so we can advise you about secondary admissions so you can make informed decisions for your child.

11+ testing applications open 1st May and secondary school applications open 1st September; we will explain how to go about applying for your child and answer any questions you may have.



Statutory Testing

During the Summer there are various tests that are required by the Standards and Testing Agency:

Year 1 phonics screening check completed 7 – 17th June by a familiar teacher with individual pupils

Year 2 – SATs completed from 16th May in class

Year 4 – Multiplication tables check during June – completed individually online


Year 6 – KS2 SATs completed Monday 9th – Thursday 12th May



Children will be supported by familiar adults so that they do not become anxious and will be prepared in advance so that they are familiar with the format. Please don't worry about these testing formats - year groups will send specific details out to parents to help children at home. Please reassure your children and make sure they have a good bedtime routine so that they feel confident and well rested.


