Dear Families & Friends,

Thank-you so much for your kind donations to Charles Thomson Mission and The Foodbank and for attending our end of term services; it was so lovely to see so many friends and families in church!

lessons in Year 5; the Roman invasion in Year 4; our Year 1 and Year 2 pupils enjoying school trips to the Farm and Catalyst Museum where they all made us very proud and passers-by commented upon the children's excellent conduct! We welcomed PC Allinson and Otis to school to learn about the work of a police dog and handler and celebrated world mental health day with cheerful melon smiles and learning how to look after ourselves and each other.



Pre-School Celebrations

A great achievement for our school has been the new F1 Pre-School, which admitted pupils this September. After years of planning and working towards a provision for 3 year olds, it is fabulous to see our youngest children thriving in school. To celebrate we will be having a formal *opening for the current Pre-School pupils and their families on Wednesday 2nd November* and the whole school will be gifted a

Christ Church cupcake to celebrate this historic development for our school. Thank-you so much to all those families who have supported our provision and those who are waiting for their children to join us in January and April this year. We are filling up fast, so if you are considering a place for your three year old, please do not delay as we don't want our families to be disappointed and bookings for the Spring term are already very popular. To meet the increasing demand we have recruited an additional early years practitioner to join our F1 team; Mrs Sarah Kerr joins us in Preschool this term and we wish her every success and happiness working in Christ Church. We are now arranging transition visits for our January intake with families so you can see the new facilities and visit the wider school. school effectiveness team from CDAT visited to look at the provision for our pupils. The visit was very successful with our Early Years department and new Preschool being a highlight as well as the development of our curriculum and the strong subject specialisms available at Christ Church. The Trust will continue to work with us this year to offer further support and challenge, but the conclusion was that that the school, 'consistently and reliably provide pupils with a good or better standard of education'. Wirral Local Authority has also undertaken its review of schools and determined that Christ Church is in a positive position with good capacity.

Our priorities for this academic year are:

- To embed our new phonics scheme and improve outcomes
- To increase the number of pupils achieving greater depth in their learning across the school
- To develop immediate interventions so that children keep up with learning
- To build children's confidence and mindset so that they persevere and tackle challenges in learning and friendships confidently without giving up
- To develop emotional resilience and provide further training for staff in reducing anxiety
- To continue to decrease absenteeism
- To focus on healthy eating and participation, getting the most from our allotment and outdoor areas and exploring a wide range of activities for pupils to engage in
- To ensure sustainability by growing the school and managing increasing costs effectively whilst continuing to develop resources and provision on offer for our pupils

We will be asking parents and pupils their views over the next few weeks so we can include

your priorities in our planning too.





Site Management

We are very proud to have been awarded Gold Standard in our recent external Health & Safety Inspection. The premises team and all staff work hard to keep our school safe for pupils and visitors and it was great to have this recognised. It was also a great recognition for our Site Manager Garry Jones who will be retiring at Christmas; he is sad to be leaving us but ready for a rest! We are currently recruiting for his replacement and have also extended our premises team by employing a new grounds person to focus on developing our outdoor spaces; Mike Smith will be joining our team this month and we are excited to welcome him!

Training and Development

As part of CDAT's teaching school provision, we have welcomed three graduate students who will train with us this year to complete their Qualified Teaching Status. We have delivered training for our Associate Teachers as part of the School Direct Programme as well as delivering sessions for the National Professional Qualification for Senior Leaders and the National Professional Qualification for Leading Behaviour & Culture. Christ Church is hosting Speech and Language Therapist training for local schools and we are supporting the development of Recently Qualified teachers across Chester Diocese. All of these professional opportunities help us to keep knowledgeable about education and ensure teachers are up to date and providing the best we can for your children.

Attendance

With so much going on in school, it is important that your child doesn't miss out on any of the opportunities to learn and socialise. Lateness and absence makes it very hard for children to develop socially and emotionally. We do understand that if children are poorly they should stay at home until they are well and the office can advise on the length of absence in these cases, however we have many families booking term time holidays or children arriving late for school. Please support your child and work with us on their attendance – we can't teach them or help with their development if they aren't here. If you are having any difficulties please contact Mrs Gill Baker in the first instance and she will look at ways in which we can support you and your child.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium Support

As the cost of living reaches such high levels it is worth checking to see if your family is eligible for any support. Applying and checking is easy, just contact Mrs Rebecca Baker in the school office and she will be happy to advise you. You will qualify if you are receiving one of the following:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit but not Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Parking

May we please request that parents park considerately when dropping off and collecting their children from school, and do not pull up in front of driveways or on the narrow pathways as this causes traffic congestion and stops local residents from accessing their properties. The driveway at the side of the school building is only to be accessed for CC4C drop off and collection before 8.30am and after 4pm for safety or for those families whose children have mobility issues. The driveway should not be used as a drop off point so please make sure we keep children safe around the school site and neighbouring roads.
